# Our Roots, our Future: Experiencing Canada's National Historic Sites

## A. TASK

- Choose a National Historic site in Canada.
- By researching questions A & B below, answer this guiding question:

# Why is (your choice) a National Historic Site of Canada?

- A. Historical background of the site (include relevant, interesting facts that answer these questions or others):
  - i. What is it?
  - ii. Who was involved?
  - iii. What happened there?
  - iv. Why was it established?
  - v. Where is it?
  - vi. When was it established?
- B. Why is this site important?
  - i. What criteria make is a National Historic Site? (cut & paste the answer into your presentation).

A place may become a national historic site because it is nationally significant in Canadian history. A site, building, district, or cultural landscape of national historic importance will:

- a) illustrate an exceptional **creative achievement in concept and design**, **technology** and/or **planning**, or a **significant** stage in the development of Canada; or
- b) illustrate **a cultural tradition**, **a way of life**, or **ideas** important in the development of Canada; or
- c) be **associated** or identified **with persons** who are deemed of national historic importance; or
- d) be **associated** or identified **with events** that are deemed of national historic importance.
- ii. What kinds of things would be of interest to you if you visited this site?

#### **B. PROCESS:**

- a. Research.
- b. Gather information and take notes. Ask for note sheets if you want.
- c. Keep track of links to your sources and put them in the last slide.
- d. Organize & present your information in PowerPoint.

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## C. PRODUCT:

- **PowerPoint** presentation\*. Include:
  - i. Information that effectively answers your research questions in your own words or quoted not just cut & pasted.
  - ii. Pictures, video, graphics or sound files
  - iii. A title slide with the name of the site, your name, date & block
  - iv. A bibliography of more than 3 sources links on the last slide.

#### D. **EVALUATION**:

- Daily mark based your effective use of library research time.
- Evaluation of your PowerPoint: content & presentation format (see rubric)
