A. TASK

- Choose a National Historic site in Canada.
- By researching questions A C below, answer this guiding question:

Why is (your choice) a National Historic Site of Canada?

- A. Historical background of the site (include relevant, interesting facts that answer these questions or others):
 - i. What is it?
 - ii. Who was involved?
 - iii. What happened there?
 - iv. Why was it established?
 - v. Where is it?
 - vi. When was it established?
- B. Why has it been designated as a **National Historic Site**?
 - i. How does it meet the criteria of a National Historic Site (see link)?
 - ii. What efforts have been made to preserve or renew the site for the public?
 - iii. How does the existence of this site benefit the Canadian public?
- C. What kinds of things would be of interest to you if you visited this site?

B. PROCESS:

- a. Research.
- b. Gather information and take notes. Ask for note sheets if you want.
- c. Keep track of your sources to make a **formatted bibliography**.
- d. Organize & present your information in Prezi or PowerPoint.

C. PRODUCT:

- **Prezi** or **PowerPoint** presentation*. Include:
 - i. Information that effectively answers your research questions in your own words or quoted not just cut & pasted.
 - ii. Pictures, video, graphics or sound files
 - iii. A title slide with the name of the site, your name, date & block
 - iv. A bibliography of at least 3 sources (printed & submitted)
