

# WWII HOCKEY CARD ASSIGNMENT

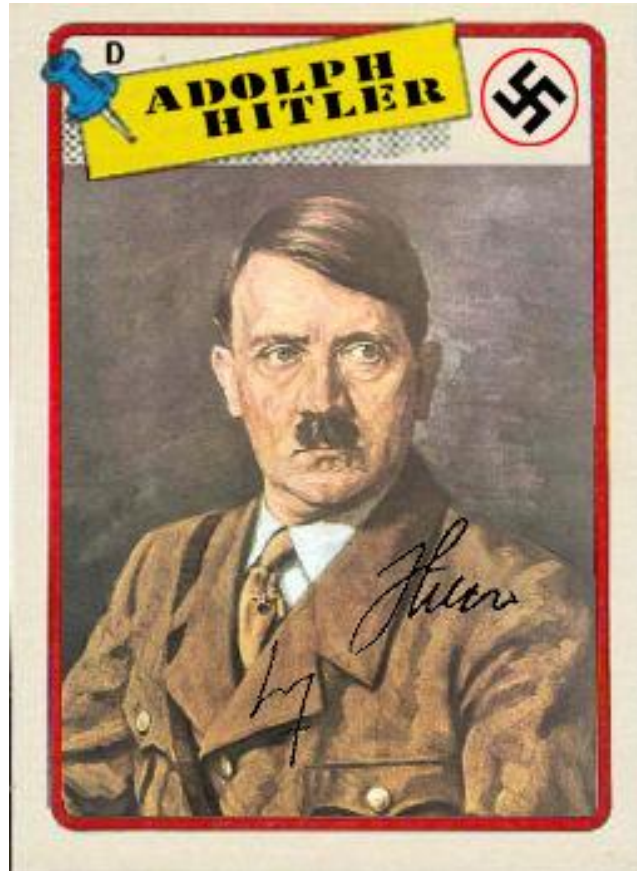
## Task:

- You are to take the information you have gathered and display it in the same format as a hockey card.

**Assessment:**

- This Assignment is worth **50 marks**. These can be earned as follows:
  - Accuracy/Detail (20)
    - Is the information on your card historically accurate?
    - Did you research your topic? Is this evident in your work? Did you provide sufficient detail?
  - Effort/Appeal (20)
    - Did you put an appropriate amount of effort into this project? Does it show?
    - Would your card attract collectors based on its appearance? Is it eye-catching?
  - Authenticity (10)
    - Does your submission actually look like a hockey card?
